


## Distance-Based Degrees


#### DISTANCE-BASED DEGREE TRENDS

The 2016 Criteria maintain the same expectations for distance-based degrees as for campus-based degrees. In addition, the criteria require units to demonstrate that they have the necessary supports and policies that may be unique to distance-based degrees. As more students seek to earn degrees in distance-based formats and the technology to support these offerings improves, it is important for CEPH to monitor trends in delivery format.

The number of units offering distance-based degree programs increased during 2017-2019 from 60 units (29 SPH, 31 PHP, 0 SBP) to 89 units (33 SPH, 56 PHP, 0 SBP). Nine accredited PHP do not offer on-campus public health degree programs at all—all of their CEPH-accredited degree offerings are delivered via distance.

# DEFINING DISTANCEBASED DEGREES


For accreditation purposes, CEPH classifies degrees as distance-based if they are designed in a manner that would allow a student to complete the degree program while residing outside of reasonable travel range to the campus.

Most CEPH-accredited units offer classes or portions of the curriculum using distance technology but design their degree offerings to be completed by students who will regularly travel to campus.

Distance-based degrees may require some minimal attendance on campus, e.g., for orientation; for limited, condensed on-site courses during the summer or on a weekend; or to present and/or defend final projects.

### DISTANCE-BASED MPH CONCENTRATIONS

MPH concentrations in SBS and general public health are the most prevalent distance-based offerings; this aligns with the fact that SBS is the most common concentration across all accredited MPH degrees, regardless of delivery method. Concentrations with fewer than five offerings are not presented. These include the following: clinical investigation, emergency preparedness, parks and recreation, dental public health, veterinary public health, and sustainable development.
